Autopsy, histology, toxicology



### <u>Macroscopic</u>

Moderate asphyxia syndrome without clear ligature marks

<u>Histologic</u>

Hemorrhagic suffusion of the larynx (no bony callus)

Residual thymus:

chronic drug addiction

Point of support lesions

(elbow, chest)

myoglobinury ?

**3-MMC**:

824 ng/mL

**Granular cylinders** 

in renal tubules:

Intense signs of hemodynamic shock

# Autopsy

<u>Hair</u>

3-MMC + GHB :

chronic consumption in the last months Toxicology

Peripheral blood

A. THC: last use more than 12 hours before death

**B. 3-MMC**: 960 ng/mL, potentially <u>lethal</u>

## <u>Viscera</u>

kidney: 168 ng/mg

**3-MMC**:

liver: 264 ng/mg

lung: 248 ng/mg

heart: 272 ng/mg

Low concentrations, but potentiates the toxic effects of the associated molecules

24 mg/L

C. GHB:

**D. Ethanol**: 0.73 g/L

Cerebral distribution

C/F ratio (7.62):

cardiac tropism

brain: <u>700 ng/mg</u>

### **Conclusion**

We described the complexity of a case combining mechanical asphyxia by atypical hanging (autoerotic), and lethal intoxication by 3-MMC.
